Originally built as a Summerhouse and Tea Room for the Countess of Orkney in 1813, set on the banks of the River Thames within the Cliveden Estate, Spring Cottage offers the utmost in privacy and escapism...

One of the most beautiful cottages on the Thames, Spring Cottage takes its name from the spring that emerges from the nearby cliffs. The Duchess of Sutherland had it extended in the 1870's to become the beautiful Cottage you see today.

Ironically this little haven of pastoral bliss became the centre of a violent political storm in the early '60s. It was here that Stephen Ward and Christine Keeler were staying when they triggered the infamous Profumo scandal. So, even the cottage is not without its share of colourful Cliveden history.


